So quickly: and easy to come and easy to go. Within one week, sometimes even within a day, the entire profits of a year are sometimes executed, especially if it rumors and speculation rattles the stock exchange.

The spirit of optimism that was felt at the Equity Forum in November 2009 still seems to be gone with the slip of the DAX at the 6,000-point mark. From the Entry and General Standard Conference, at which presented Monday through Wednesday in Frankfurt some 80 companies, therefore, went from a barely positive momentum, although the Wall Street disaster of Thursday night was yet played a role. Striking: Due to the weakness of the euro is left only a handful of Anglo-Saxon investors still looking. In particular, large-Cap Funds of Great Britain and the United States, which usually drive the optimistic course of these type of conferences. Whether it is because of currency effects, that in terms of share performance, particularly in international values such as Greater China Precision Components or the Canadian Fortress Paper were only among the few winners of the event?

But foreign companies are currently not finding it easy to get funding in their own countries. An experience that the management of LAMBDA TD Software had found out. When a daughter of the service office Triumph of Geschäftsführer Alder had to resign because she had glossed over their audited figures. The negative impact goes all the way back to year 2007 and must be reconciled, and will in all probability will result in three million euro down.
